### **What is Apologetics?**

#### **Apologetics:**

An explanation and defense of a faith or religion that is based on reason (derived from the Greek word “apologia” which means defense).

#### **Faith and Reason:**

- Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth. – John Paul II, Fides et Ratio
- Faith is not opposed to knowledge or reason; faith and reason nourish each other.
- It is important for us to understand our faith, so we can then explain it to others.

## Practical skills in apologetics:

- Part of our Baptismal call is to share our faith and be prepared to explain our faith to all who ask.
- It is important to study resources so that we are prepared when God calls us to explain the Catholic faith to others.
- No matter what we study and how much we know, we sometimes might not know the answer to a question or objection. One must practice intellectual humility: It's better to admit that you don't know the answer than to misinform someone with the wrong answer.
- Be original – Try to be creative and interesting in your explanations, especially when giving a talk. Relate the topic to real life, try to make it personal.

## Resources Past and Present:

- Every aspect of the teachings of the Catholic Church has been criticized throughout history at some point.
  - The real presence of Christ in the Eucharist (2<sup>nd</sup> Century)
  - Mary's Perpetual Virginity (4<sup>th</sup> Century)
- Two-thousand years of Church history have yielded these resources:
  - **The Bible**
  - **The Catechism of the Catholic Church**
  - The Writings of the Church Fathers (esp. Doctors of the Church)
  - The Magisterium (i.e. Church Councils)
  - The Summa Theologica by St. Thomas Aquinas
  - Your Friends at Aggie CAT
